Lyme Disease is transmitted throughout New England by the **Deer Tick**. Nymphal ticks, which are active from **May-July**, are most responsible for human cases of Lyme Disease. The adult ticks are also able to spread infection, and they are active from **October-December** and also **April-June**.

Dog ticks **do not** transmit Lyme Disease. They are however, found throughout northern New England from **April-August**.

To avoid tick bites:

- * Wear light colored clothes, tuck pantlegs into socks
- * Inspect yourself closely after being outdoors
- * Shower and wash clothes soon after coming indoors
(heat drying will kill ticks on clothing)
- * Use a DEET based repellent on skin and clothing
