If you've ever ordered a book from Amazon.com or Barnesandnoble.com you may have noticed that readers have the ability to post reviews of books for other potential readers to see. This interactive aspect of websites is becoming common, and is part of what is now referred to as Web 2.0. For their recent book report, WMS seventh graders have joined the ranks of online reviewers. They have written reviews of books they have read, and these reviews are being posted in Destiny, the WMS online card catalog. It was a challenge for many students, as Destiny only allows them 1,000 characters per review. Students had to be concise while covering required review elements.
